

BACCALAUREATE MINORS IN HISTORY:

The target audience is comprised of students from all baccalaureate majors who would like to pursue the study of history in greater depth than the core curriculum alone can provide. The minor will allow them to pursue this interest in a more systematic way.

Students may choose to minor in either World History or U.S. History. The requirements for each are listed below.

MINOR IN WORLD HISTORY

Students will complete HIST 1111 and HIST 1112 in the core curriculum. The minor consists of the following:

Historical methods	HIST 3000	normally offered every semester
One African, Middle East or Latin American history course	Choose from HIST 3100, 3150, 3151, or 3230	one or more of these courses will be offered each fall and spring
One Asian history course	Choose from HIST 3200, 3210 or 4220	one or more of these courses will be offered each fall and spring
One European history course	Choose from HIST 3440, 3460, 3470, 3480, or 3490	one or more of these courses will be offered each fall and spring
One comparative or thematic history course	Choose from HIST 4010, 4020, 4030, or 4040	one or more of these courses will be offered each fall and spring
One other advanced history course	Choose from HIST 4290, 4308, 4320, 4330, 4336, or 4360	one or more of these courses will be offered each fall and spring

MINOR IN U.S. HISTORY

Students will complete HIST 2111 and HIST 2112 in the core curriculum. The minor consists of the following:

Historical methods	HIST 3000	offered every semester
Two U.S. history courses defined by time period	Choose from HIST 3710, 3720, 3730, 3750, 3760, 3770, 3790, 3901, 3902, or 3930	one or more of these courses will be offered each semester
Three U.S. history courses defined by theme or region	Choose from HIST 4700, 4710, 4720, 4740, 4760, 4777, 4778, 4820, or 4821	one or more of these courses will be offered each fall and spring
