The Center for Career & Leadership Development includes both career development services and student leadership programs for all MGA students. With these resources together in one department, we are focused on helping students develop skills through internships and leadership programs while also providing resources that help them explore and identify the right career opportunities for them. We also teach them how to facilitate a successful job, internship, and graduate school search, which includes helping them learn how to articulate their skills in their resumes, interviews, cover letters, personal statements, and other items related to their specific career path. We also provide networking opportunities to help students make connections with employers and graduate programs.

Career Resource Liaisons can be a resource in the following ways:

- Appointments with students (virtually & in-person) scheduled via Handshake
- Classroom presentations: resumes, interviewing, job/internship/grad school search, career readiness, LinkedIn, etc.
- Collaborating on a discipline-focused event for students (i.e., mock interviews with employers)
- Developing discipline-focused career materials (i.e., resume samples, interview questions, etc.)
- Providing relevant occupational information to students in your disciplines
- Instructing students on current resume, interviewing, application, networking, and other career trends
- Assisting employers with posting a job or internship to Handshake and reaching students

- Internship Program: To support students who need and want recognition for their non-academic credit internships, CCLD offers CDIE 0999. Students report their internship to the CCLD and receive recognition on their transcript through this tuition free, non-credit opportunity. This program helps students gain professional work experience and explore career options through supervised paid and unpaid work experiences related to their program of study.

FAQ

· Do you help with resumes?

Yes! We coach students through all aspects of the job application process, including interviews.

· Do you have job listings?

Yes! We work with employers who want to hire MGA students for jobs and internships. These opportunities are posted on Handshake at mga.joinhandshake.com.

· What about campus jobs?

These are listed through MGA Human Resources. However, we can help with the application process!

· Can students just drop in?

Sure, but we can't guarantee that someone will be able to meet with them for more than 5 - 10 minutes. An appointment ensures that a student gets our full attention.

How does the Professional Closet Work?

We have a closet in Macon and Cochran where students can buy lightly used professional attire. Suits are \$5 and most individual pieces are \$3 or less. At our events, we also give out coupons for free items. We take donations at the Macon and Cochran offices. Business suits, shoes, slacks, knee-length skirts, and button down shirts in a modern, professional style are the primary need.

How do you decide which employers come to a career fair?

We invite all employers in the Handshake database and publicly promote our fairs on our website. We also have alumni, faculty, and staff who help make referrals to us - it takes a village to connect our students to new opportunities! Some employers are less likely to recruit at career fairs, so we also coach students on the multiple ways to search for jobs within their industry. Career fairs are just one way to make connections.
