Apple II Plus

The Apple II Plus was a personal computer released by Apple Inc. in 1979. It was an upgraded version of the original Apple II computer and featured improvements such as increased memory and a faster processor. It was popular among early personal computer enthusiasts, particularly in education and business sectors. It retailed for \$1,195.

The Apple II Plus had a standard configuration of 48KB of RAM, a keyboard, and a power supply, and additional peripherals like a floppy disk drive or a printer could be added. The Apple II Plus was known for its user-friendly interface, versatility, and expandability, which made it a significant contributor to the development of personal computing. It was eventually replaced by newer models of the Apple II series in the 1980s.
