The IBM PS/2 Model 25 is a personal computer produced by IBM in the late 1980s. It was part of the IBM PS/2 series of computers and was a lower-end model aimed at home and small business users. The Model 25 was released in 1987 and featured an Intel 80286 microprocessor running at 6 MHz, 1MB of RAM (expandable to 6MB) and a built-in keyboard at a cost of \$2095. It had a built-in 3.5-inch floppy drive for data storage and a VGA monitor could be connected to it for display. It came with the IBM's OS/2 operating system and it was known for its compact design.

The IBM PS/2 Model 25 was a cost-effective option for users looking for a reliable and compatible computer that could run OS/2 and other IBM-compatible software.
