

Tandy TRS-80 Model 4

The TRS-80 Model 4 was a home computer released by Tandy Corporation in 1983. It was the successor to the TRS-80 Model III and was designed to be a more powerful and versatile machine. The Model 4 featured a faster Z80A 4 MHz CPU, larger video display of 80 columns by 24 rows, bigger keyboard, and could be upgraded to 128KB of RAM. It was compatible with Model III software and CP/M application software.

The TRS-80 Model 4 was available in two basic configurations: the Model 4D and the Model 4P. The Model 4D was a desktop unit with a built-in 12-inch display, while the Model 4P was a portable unit with a 9-inch display. Both models could be connected to external monitors and printers.

The TRS-80 Model 4 was originally priced at \$1,295 for the Model 4D and \$1,495 for the Model 4P. However, prices were reduced in 1984 to \$1,095 and \$1,295, respectively.

The TRS-80 Model 4 was a popular computer in its day and was well-received by reviewers. However, it was ultimately unable to compete with the growing popularity of 16-bit computers such as the IBM PC. The Model 4 was discontinued in 1991.
