Earn a grade of “C” or higher in English, Math, Science and the PSYC 1101, PSYC 2103, BIOL 2251, BIOL 2252 and BIOL 2260 courses.

Satisfy: It is suggested that students pursuing a BSN degree complete one of the following lab science sequences: BIOL 1001-1002, BIOL 2107-2108, CHEM 1151-1152, CHEM 1211-1212, PHYS 1111-1112, or PHYS 2211-2212 and MATH 1401 as the Stem Elective. It is also suggested that students take PSYC 1101 as a Social Science Elective. Not completing the recommended course may require additional credit hour accrual. Meet with your Academic Advisor at least once per semester. Minimum Overall GPA of All College Courses 3.0.
