Donald R. Avery, FACHE (Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives), has served as president and CEO of Fairview Park Hospital since 2008. He is responsible for the management and day-to-day operations of the 190-bed facility located in Dublin, Georgia.

During his tenure, the hospital has earned recognition and awards for safety and quality outcomes and has successfully recruited more than 50 new physicians to the community to ensure better access to care.

Prior to serving in this role, Avery was the CEO of the Hughston Orthopedic Hospital in Columbus, senior vice president at Columbus Regional Health System, and the chief

operating officer at South Georgia Medical Center in Valdosta.

After graduating from the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Avery served in the Air Force as a pilot, instructor pilot, and operations officer for six years. He later enrolled in the University of Florida, earning master's degrees in business administration and health science.

Brigadier General Jon A. Eberlan Commander, Warner Robins Air Logistics Complex Robins Air Force Base

As Commander, at the Warner Robins Air Logistics Complex, Robins Air Force Base, Brig. Gen. Jon A. Eberlan serves a world-class workforce of more than 7,200 personnel. The complex performs programmed depot maintenance and modification on all variants of the F-15, C-130, C-5, C-17, and special operations forces aircraft as well as the RQ-4, E8C, and TH-1H.

Additionally, he is responsible for the maintenance, repair, and overhaul of diverse aircraft components, avionics, and electronic warfare equipment along with development and sustainment of missions-critical software, test program sets, and automated test equipment.

Brig. Gen. Eberlan enlisted in the Air Force in 1990 and earned his commission as a distinguished graduate of Officer Training School in August 1998. He has commanded at the squadron, group, and wing levels. He also has served in key major command, Air Staff and joint duty positions.

Among his degrees are a bachelor of science in business management from Park College, a master of science in logistics management from the Air Force Institute of Technology, a Top-third Graduate of Squadron Officer School from Maxwell Air Force Base, a master of military operational art and science from Air Command and Staff College, a master of science in National Resource Strategy from Dwight D. Eisenhower School at Fort Lesley J. McNair, and a Military Fellow from the Council of Foreign Relations.

His assignments include Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas; Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Arizona; Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio; Langley Air Force Base, Virginia; Seymour Johnson Air Force Base, North Carolina; Allied Air Component Command Headquarters, Izmir, Turkey; Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama; Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska; U.S. Air Force Headquarters, the Pentagon, Virginia; the Office of Security Cooperation, United States Embassy, Baghdad, Iraq; and Al Udeid Air Base, Qatar.

In 2020, he served as a Military Fellow on the Council of Foreign Relations in New York City. In 2021, he served as the Director of Budget Programs and Deputy Assistant Secretary for Budget in the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for Financial Management and Comptroller at the Pentagon.

His major awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit with oak leaf cluster; the Defense Meritorious Service Medal; the Meritorious Service Medal with five oak leaf clusters; the Joint Service Commendation Medal; the Air Force Commendation Medal with three oak leaf clusters; and the Air Force Achievement Medal with two oak leaf clusters.

Colonel Sheldon B. Wilson Commander, 165th Airlift Wing Georgia Air National Guard

Colonel Sheldon B. Wilson is the Commander of the 165th Airlift Wing, Georgia Air National Guard, Savannah. As the commander, he provides leadership to more than 1,400 Airmen organized across four Groups and two geographically separated units, the 224th Joint Communication Support Squadron in Brunswick and the 117th Air Control Squadron at Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia. He helps ensure the Wing and its Airmen are trained and equipped to support domestic operations and overseas missions at a moment's notice.

Colonel Wilson enlisted in the Air Force Reserves in 1993 as a medical technician, Joint Base Charleston, South Carolina. Upon graduation from The Citadel, he was recruited as an Air

Battle Manager with the 117th Air Control Squadron, Savannah. After being commissioned, he was assigned to a two-year tour as an executive officer with the National Guard Bureau; Command, Control, Communications, Airspace, and Ranges Branch, Joint Base Andrews, Maryland.

During his tour, he was selected for a mobility pilot position with the 165th Airlift Wing. He entered undergraduate pilot training in 2000 and earned his wings in 2002 at Columbus Air Force Base, Mississippi.

Within four months of returning to the 165th Airlift Wing, he deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Over the next 18 years, he deployed nine times in support of Operations Iraqi Freedom, Enduring Freedom, Freedom Sentinel, and Inherent Resolve.

Colonel Wilson has also deployed in support of the European Command as a Detachment Commander for the Air Reserve Component to manage C-130 operations. In 2019 he became the 165th Operations Group Commander. Prior to assuming his current position, he served as the Vice Commander, 116th Air Control Wing, Robins Air Force Base, where he was responsible for assisting the commander with the worldwide employment of the E-8C Joint Surveillance Target Attack Radar System aircraft.

He has a bachelor's degree in biology from The Citadel, South Carolina; Intermediate Development Course, Joint Base Andrews, Maryland; Air Command and Staff College, by correspondence, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama; and Air War College, by correspondence, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama.

Among his major awards and decorations are Meritorious Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters; Air Medal with five oak leaf clusters; Air Force Commendation Medal; Air Force Outstanding Unit Award with Valor Device with oak leaf cluster; Combat Readiness Medal with four oak leaf clusters; National Defense Service Medal; Afghanistan Campaign Medal with oak leaf cluster; Iraq Campaign Medal with oak leaf cluster; Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal; and Humanitarian Service Medal.

ACADEMIC HONORS

By designation in the commencement program and on the diploma, Middle Georgia State University honors those graduates receiving bachelor's and associate's degrees who have excelled academically.

The Latin phrases *Summa Cum Laude* (with highest honor), *Magna Cum Laude* (with great honor), and *Cum Laude* (with honor) are used to identify the levels of achievement. These designations apply only to students receiving the baccalaureate degree. To graduate with honors, a baccalaureate student must have completed at least 60 semester hours of course work at Middle Georgia State University and earned a cumulative institutional GPA of at least 3.5:

3.90 – 4.00

Magna Cum Laude

3.70 – 3.89

Cum Laude

3.50 – 3.69

PRESIDENT'S SCHOLAR

The Middle Georgia State University Student Honors and Awards Committee, with the approval of the President of the University, designates a student or students from the senior class to serve as President's Scholar at Spring Commencement.

This designation is the highest honor given to a graduating senior at the institution. The student chosen must have an exceptional academic record at Middle Georgia State, be involved in campus and/or community activities, and demonstrate characteristics indicating the promise of a successful future.

ACADEMIC RECOGNITION DAY SCHOLAR

Academic Recognition Day, a program sponsored by the University System of Georgia, honors top scholars from each of the state's public colleges and universities. Nominees for Academic Recognition Day Scholar must be residents of Georgia and display outstanding scholastic achievement. Faculty members nominate students for the honor.

PRESIDENT'S LIST SCHOLAR

Students are designated a President's List Scholar if they complete the associate's degree or bachelor's degree with an overall institutional grade point average of 3.80–4.00. The President's List Scholar is graduated with honors.

DEAN'S LIST SCHOLAR

Students are designated a Dean's List Scholar if they complete the associate's degree or bachelor's degree with an overall institutional grade point average of 3.50–3.79. The Dean's List Scholar is graduated with honors.

HONORS PROGRAM GRADUATE

A bachelor's degree student who completes eight Honors Program courses with a grade of "B" or better and has an overall institutional grade point average of at least 3.50 is designated an Honors Program Graduate.

An associate's degree student who completes four Honors Program courses with a grade of "B" or better and has an overall institutional grade point average of at least 3.50 is designated an Honors Program Graduate.

HONORS DISCIPLINE GRADUATE

A bachelor's degree student who completes four upper-level Honors Program courses in a specific program of study with a grade of "B" or better in each and has an overall institutional grade point average of at least 3.50 is designated an Honors Discipline Graduate.

ACADEMIC EMBLEMS

THE MACE

Originally a medieval weapon, the mace evolved into a symbol of military power and civil authority. Many colleges and universities now use it as a ceremonial emblem during formal observances as a reminder that education is a symbol of the institution's authority to confer degrees. The Middle Georgia State University mace is 48 inches in height and made of walnut with brass accents.

THE PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

The President of the University wears the Chain of Office and Medallion as a sign of authority. The Middle Georgia State University medallion is embossed with the University seal.

THE GONFALONS

Gonfalons are ceremonial banners or pennants suspended from a crossbar. They are used by many institutions of higher education to add ceremony to commencement exercises and formal academic occasions. Gonfalons date back to medieval Italy where they were used as symbols of office or state.



ACADEMIC REGALIA

ACADEMIC REGALIA

In its essential features, the academic regalia worn at American college commencement exercises had its beginning in the Middle Ages. The oldest universities of Northern Europe grew out of church schools, and both faculty and students were regarded as a part of the clergy. Hence, as their regular costume, they wore clerical garb borrowed largely from the monastic dress of their day.

The academic gown and hood were first regularly adopted by Cambridge University in 1284 and by Oxford University later. The custom was transplanted to this country in colonial times by King's College, now Columbia University, in New York.

In 1895 American universities and colleges decided to standardize their academic styles and developed the intercollegiate code of academic costume. The style follows in the Cambridge tradition. The distinctive caps, gowns, and hoods worn at present-day college and university functions denote the institution that granted the degree, the field of learning in which the degree was earned and the level of the degree — bachelor, master, or doctorate.

The gown is usually of black material (serge or worsted for bachelor's, the same or silk for master's, and silk for doctorate). Bachelor's gowns have pointed sleeves and master's gowns have long pouch-like sleeves. Doctorate gowns are faced with panels of velvet down the front and three bars of velvet across each sleeve. Four bars across each sleeve indicate a doctorate as well as a president or chancellor of an institution.

The cap — the square mortar-board in most American universities — but a round, soft, flat velvet hat in British, Canadian, and some European universities — bears a tassel, which may be black or it may be a color according to the scholarly field of the wearer. Only the doctorate cap may be of velvet.

The hood, worn around the neck so as to hang down the back, is the principal emblem of the nature and source of the degree held. The colors in the hood lining are the colors of the school conferring the degree. The color of the border indicates the scholarly field of the wearer. Hoods may be worn only after the degree has been granted.

The degree colors are appropriate to the category of the degree rather than to the specific major subject. For example, the appropriate color for a degree in Arts & Letters is white; in Commerce (Business), drab; in Education, light blue; in Science, golden yellow; in Medicine, green; and so on. These colors are used for the edging of all hoods and may be used for the velvet facing and sleeve bars for doctorate gowns and tassels on bachelor's and master's caps.

A TRADITION BEGINS

President Christopher Blake introduced what is now a tradition at Middle Georgia State University's commencement ceremonies. After the Candidates for Degree receive their diplomas, the President confers their degrees/certificates. To signify passage from Candidate for Degree to Graduate, each graduate moves the tassel on her/his cap from the right side to the left side.

The President asks the front row of graduates to move their tassels accordingly, then he asks them to turn around and move the tassels of those in the second row, who then turn around and do the same for the third row and so on.

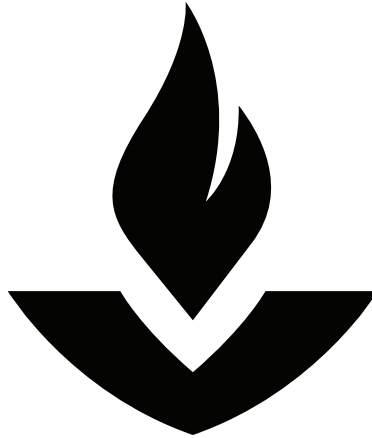
