What changes were implemented based on an analysis of the students' performance on these Student Learning Outcomes? Looking at the data for the prior cycle of Fall 2017 - Spring 2018, the Art History Assessment Rubric average for SLO #2 was 83.7%. Fall 2018's – Spring 2019's initiative was "After students take their first test or quiz that deals with the influence of other cultures in some way, they will write a 300-word minimum essay on the portion they did the weakest on and tell how the time period in which an artist lived was affected by other cultures, citing multiple examples of how this takes place." For Fall 2018 - Spring of 2019, the Art History Assessment Rubric average for SLO #2 was 87.5%. Improvement was made.
	Looking at all the data for Fall 2018 & Spring 2019, SLO #3 had the lowest average at 72.1%. The Fall 2019 – Spring 2020 New Plan/Initiative is "Students will write a 150-word or longer critique with each major assignment to hand in along with their project. It should analyze their art from the project and talk about how it succeeds and needs improvement. Additionally, students will cumulatively critique/assess their work as a cohesive body at the end of the semester in a 300-word or longer critique."
Open Box for Assessment Comments	Question 11 Response: The total average of 43 students scored using the Art Studio Course Portfolio Assessment Rubric was 79.1% (34 out of 43 students scored 80% or better on the rubric). The goal of 80% was not met. Question 16 Response: The total average of 56 students scored using the Art History Assessment Rubric was 87.5% (49 out of 56 students scored 80% or better on the rubric). The goal of 80% was met. *This was an online class, because of the way the information was collected, it was not possible to distinguish between the Cochran & Macon campuses.
	Question 21 Response: The total average of 43 students scored using the Studio Critique

	Assessment Rubric was 72.1% (31 out of 43 students scored 80% or better on the rubric). The goal of 80% was not met.
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
