Program goal is met. In AY 19-20, the program did not meet its goal. In a meeting, the language faculty decided to implement the following learning initiative: an inclass review targeting the grammar needed to complete the writing assignment and addressing some commonly made mistakes. For AY 20-21, the program has met its goal for SLO with 100% of students successful. An analysis of the rubric shows that after the essay revision, all students scored at least 80 in the "grammatical structures" criterion. The program will therefore continue the learning initiative implemented this year.

Program goal is not met. Due to COVID for AY 19-20, the instrument was changed from a test portion to the cultural oral presentation. This year, the program returned to its original assessment instrument consisting of cultural questions on the final exam. The program had a learning initiative in place for SLO4 in AY 18-19 that consisted of an in-class review of cultural concepts and that was not successful. The ML faculty met this year and modified this learning initiative: the review will consist of a review quiz with multiple attempts that be conducted in class or online.

Prior Year Initiatives: We have 2 ongoing learning initiatives that have been successful to meet our goals: a reading comprehension workshop for SLO 3, a targeted grammar review for SLO 2. Assessment Initiative/Plan for Upcoming Year: The learning initiative for SLO 4 (Graduates will identify and summarize cultural knowledge from various texts) has not been successful. The faculty met and decided to have a review quiz with unlimited attempts as a learning initiative for AY 21-22. To ensure continuous improvement, additional plans have been developed to assess curricular changes. The ML faculty reviewed the Modern Language program SLOs to ensure consistency between program goals, classroom practice, and assessment tools. The revised program SLOs are the following (changes in bold): 1. Graduates will apply target language proficiency in oral form. 2. Graduates will apply target language proficiency in essays evaluated on content, grammar, sentence structure, vocabulary, and organization. 3. Graduates will interpret main ideas, key information, and specific arguments from written passages in the target language. 4. Graduates will identify and/or summarize cultural knowledge from various sources.
