Although the target *80%* was not quite reached in Spring 2023, it was reached at 100% in Spring 2022 (and 94% in the year prior to that). In Spring 2023, only 4 out of 17 students did not reach the 70% performance target, so the deviation from the target might be due to small sample size/random error. We will continue to monitor the results in Spring 2024 to consider if there is consistency in the weakening of performance.
