Students will gain independence and knowledge in course material and study skills competence by attending in-person and online tutoring at MGA's Student Success Centers (SSC) and by increased participation in scheduling appointments on WC Online.

(i.e. survey, participation, exam, assignment with rubric, speech, demonstration of ability)	The instrument used to measure this objective is WC Online, which is the SSC's appointment scheduler, record-keeper and reporting tool to track data crucial to the success of the center.

(i.e. 80% of all students will earn an average grade of 75% or better on.....).	The target outcome was set at a minimum of 20% increased participation.

This assessment year, the SSC continued to be affected by COVID-19. Based on the headcount of 1797 appointments, the SSC was down by 7% participation from the previous year of 1929 appointments. As overall student enrollment was down during FY20, so was the percentage of students utilizing academic resources.

The prior fiscal year was very similar in outcome. There was no significant change in student outcome.

Students will have access to tutoring in a variety of courses with a goal of 75 courses tutored per year and 70% of the tutoring requests met per academic year.

Students should have access to a minimum of 75 courses through the SSC and obtain a minimum of 70% of their tutoring requests met.

21. SLO 3: Evidence of changes based on an analysis of the results: What changes were implemented based on an analysis of the students' performance on these student learning outcomes?	Based on completed client report forms, the SSC had 44.7% of their tutoring requests met. This was lower than the anticipated goal of 70%. Students inquiring about courses PHYS 2212, ACCT, SPAN 2002, etc. were not supported as the SSC did not have peer tutors to assist with these courses during FY21. The SSC exceeded their objective in courses offered with 128 unique courses offered, but was below their objective in tutoring requests met.
