

Knights LEAD Participation Outcomes



- 13 participants with 11 returning to MGA in the fall
- 12/13 students participated in the program fall and spring
- Average GPA: 3.4 (May 2021)

Emerging Leaders Participation Outcomes

Faculty & Staff Involvement

Student Leadership Conference Participation and Outcomes

The 2021 conference was in-person and featured national speaker, Darryl Bellamy, scheduled through the Campus Speak organization. 100% of 54 survey respondents rated his presentation as Excellent or Good.

- 58% of registered students attended the conference (69 attendees; 120 registered, which met our goal for a socially distanced event.)
- 100% of surveyed attendees said they would recommend the conference to a friend






Health Services

Cases heard before student conduct panels; all cases were resolved with the professor or with a conduct officer or with residence life staff.

Highlights

- Due to COVID restrictions, all Student Conduct Board training was conducted virtually through D2L.
- Continued utilizing virtual options (Teams) in addition to face-to-face meetings to discuss adjudication options with students.
- 28.8% decrease in the number of reported academic infractions.
- Continued the strong collaboration with Residence Life to address alleged behavioral infractions in the residence halls, with more consistent reporting.
