





Trainings USG Behavior Intervention Teams/CARE Team Training

NaBita Risk Level by Case








Comparison of Cases: (2023-2024) vs. (2024-2025)



HIGHLIGHTS

- 16 Outreach Events
- Case reporting increased by 66.7% from 2023-2024 Annual Report
- Out of 90 students who took the 3rd Millennium Alcohol and Drugs courses, 38 students completed Part 2 of the program. The average pre-test score for these 38 students was 63% and post-test score was 82.32%




